what is SCYC?

South Cambridgeshire Youth Council is a group of young people between the ages of 13 an 17 who live or go to school in the district.

South Cambs Youth Council was established in 2012 to give young people a say in decisions that directly affect them. In 2014 we became members of the British Youth Council and in 2015 we joined the UK Youth Parliament. We recognise that young people in South Cambridgeshire are keen to get involved in local and national debates, and we want to hear what you have to say!

You don't need to be "into politics" to be a Youth Councillor, and the Youth Council is not party affiliated. All we ask is that you are passionate about representing young people and making a difference in your community.

The Youth Council have a very important function in supporting the work of the senior council. It is the role of the Youth Council give young people a voice that is listened to by decision makers and to involve them in decisions about issues and services that affect young people in the district.

what's in it for you?





The British Youth Council is a UK Charity whose mission is to empower young people aged 25 and under to influence and inform the decisions that affect their lives. They support young people to get involved in their communities and democracy locally, nationally and internationally, making a difference as volunteers, campaigners, decision-makers and leaders.

BYC is made up of more than 230 member organisations (including South Cambridgeshire District Council!) who support their vision for young people. Members elect their Board, determine their policies and prioritise their campaigns. They also act as the link between BYC and millions of individuals.

Youth Parliament



The UKYP aims to give the young people between the ages of 11 and 18 in the UK a voice which will be heard and listened to by local and national government, providers of services for young people and other agencies that have an interest in the views and needs of young people. It is a national body of democratically elected young people that has a rolling programme of activities across the year. This includes an Annual Sitting, Regional Meetings and regular dialogue with Ministers, including the Prime Minister and Opposition spokespeople, contributing to policy and programme development. Members of Youth Parliament (MYPs) represent different districts or cities and with the support of UKYP, make the Government, charities, companies and other organisations take the views of their peer group to adults' councils and regional assemblies. they also lead on campaigns to improve recreation and leisure facilities and transport services, in their community.

The MYP for Cambridgeshire is currently Eleanor Harris, who is also a yCllr!
